Knowledge	In Year 13, students will continue to study for the drama component of their course through a close reading and analysis of 'A Streetcar Named Desire' by Tennessee Williams. They will learn about American society after the American Civil War and the social and historical context of New Orleans and the Southern states. They will develop their skills in reading for meaning; exploration of language and its effects; exploration of dramatic devices and their effects. They will widen their knowledge of how to identify themes within texts and learn how to respond to criticism and become increasingly critical readers. Students will also learn how to respond to unseen poetry and prose and how to make valid and perceptive interpretations and comparisons. They will also revise their knowledge and understanding of the poetry of Christina Rossetti.
